Called "a civil rights legend" by *The Guardian*, George Lakey discovered Quakerism at West Chester Meeting, while a student at West Chester University (he later completed his degree at Cheyney University). He was first arrested in the civil rights movement, risked his life in Vietnam in the struggle against that war, came out publicly as bisexual, and, as an 85-year--old great-grandfather of a large interracial family, committed civil disobedience for climate justice.

Supported in his ministry for equality and peace by Central Philadelphia Monthly Meeting, George Lakey has led over 1500 workshops on five continents, twice led Yearly Meeting peace initiatives, started movement-building organizations including Jobs with Peace and Earth Quaker Action Team, taught peace studies at Swarthmore College and the University of Pennsylvania, and has published eleven books including a 2022 memoir: Dancing with History: A Life for Peace and Justice, from Seven Stories Press.
