## neighbors in ACUON

Neighbors in Action is an intergenerational program designed by the Kennett Area Senior Center in partnership with the Chester County Department of Aging Services to address the needs of elderly residents as well as people of any age.

Many homebound folks lack the resources to afford in-home care and other services they need to remain safe and healthy as they age in their own homes. They need a little assistance with a variety of issues that is affordable and readily available. Neighbors in Action, an oncall service available Monday through Friday, provides volunteers to address the needs of this population.

After a background check, volunteers are enlisted and matched, based upon interests, talents, and time available to serve. When it goes beyond the scope of the volunteer, members are matched with pre-approved vendors.

Based on their ability to pay, members pay a nominal fee to receive the assistance they require throughout the year.
